Prep Life

There's something for everyone at Twyford: in creative learning, on the sports fields, in the outdoors through Twyford Explorers, in drama, music and art, design engineering, in swimming, chess, philosophy, cookery or languages, the list goes on.

With optional Saturday school starting from Year 4 (compulsory from Year 6 onwards), our exciting Saturday Activities Programme (SAPs) offers the environment for children to explore things that might tickle their interest.

Our House system offers regular opportunities for children to participate in all sorts of sports and activities and earn valuable House points in the process. Belonging to a House is great fun, it creates a sense of loyalty and helps children develop the skills and co-operation to work together and provides platforms for leadership.

Children from every class in the School make up our School Council, an important forum in which children can put forward ideas and initiate change. It is chaired by the Heads of School who meet weekly with the Headmaster. Ideas and requests are considered and put into action.

Court Cricket

For most visitors, arriving at Twyford in the summer time is a pleasant and peaceful experience. The walk from the car park to the School Office is a tranquil stroll across the Headmaster's lawn, with the playing fields to your left and the rolling South Downs beyond. A peaceful stroll that is, unless you happen to arrive at break or lunch. For at these times, the tranquillity is disrupted as you encounter the tradition that is Court Cricket!

At its most basic level, Court Cricket is like normal cricket – batters, bowlers, fielders – but there are fundamental differences.

Teams

As one Old Twyfordian described it, (in language overly dramatic only to those who haven't played it), Court Cricket is not a team game, 'It's you versus the world!'

The Pitch

The pitch is 'Court' – an apron of concrete in front of the bare wall of the memorial library, which also acts as backstop. The concrete wall is peppered with almost a century of dents from over-enthusiastic swinging of bats, or, dare we say it, dubious batting techniques.

Batting

Batters are required to 'slog' every shot. Defensive shots result in instant dismissal, meaning Court Cricket is not for the purist. And there are numerous ways to be 'out' – bowled, caught one hand-one bounce, caught one-handed off the trees, hitting into certain bushes, hitting on to the main School roof (a very long hit indeed), hitting

on to the Headmaster's lawn, hitting cars or hitting visitors to the School! There's no need to worry though as the duty staff issue a rallying cry as visitors approach to pause the play to create a safe passage through Court. The current bats are Kwik Cricket (plastic) bats, which make a loud 'thwack' when connecting with a fast moving ball!

Bowling

Bowlers stand in line to bowl and a 'bowled' or 'edge behind' is rewarded with batting (if a batter is caught, the catcher bats). Bowlers can bowl from an 'angle' but must declare 'angle' before they release.

The real essence of Court Cricket though, is to be found in the ball, of which there are many types, all known by their Twyford abbreviations. All bowlers are required to declare their ball 'type' before they bowl. The standard balls are as follows:

TB – a standard tennis ball

Skinny TB – a shaven tennis ball – faster and lower bouncing.

SSTB – a tennis ball half covered in tape – swings violently!

STB – a fully taped tennis ball – fast and unpredictable.

It is not unusual for up to 100 children of all ages to be playing at once, or at least hovering in the vicinity in the hope of taking a lucky catch. But fielders have to keep their wits about them, with two hard balls being slogged into the crowd every four or five seconds! Accidents rarely happen, but on the odd occasion they do, children seem to take a 'hit' with surprising grace, as if just an unfortunate but accepted bi-product of Court Cricket!

Home From Home

Boarding is an integral part of Twyford life. All our teachers help with a boarding evening and our Matrons are always there to give support, lend a sympathetic ear and tend to any illness. We have Gap Assistants, who are naturally popular with the children and lend their energies to a full house life.

This safe and homely environment exudes a strong sense of community where friendships are built and flourish across all ages.



Come and watch a game of Court Cricket, a choir practice, a play rehearsal or take a peek at a few lessons. What you will know for sure is that our children want to play and have fun but also they want to learn. To learn all sorts of things and to do them well.

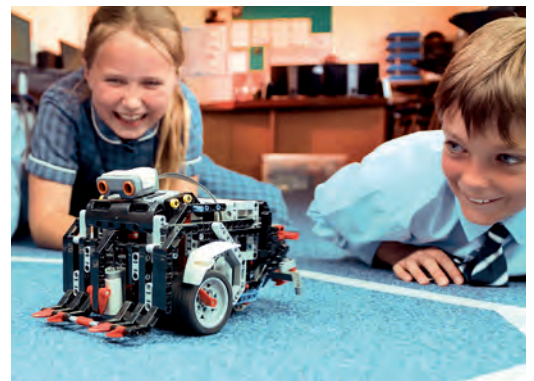


Boundless Creativity

A light, spacious and purpose built studio is home to our Art and Design Engineering & Technology Department. Our Art programme inspires children to experiment with lots of different media including sculpture, ceramics, modelling, screen printing, painting and drawing.

Children are encouraged to explore the things that interest them. They are taught artistic skills to develop their abilities and learn about proportion, the use of colour, balance and perspective. From Year 6, children can join the extra-Art Club where they can enjoy exploring new ideas and further develop their individual styles and interests.

In Design Engineering & Technology children develop a range of skills across a variety of projects, as well as developing their own dexterity through traditional hand-crafts. Recently, our Robotics club have designed hydraulic arms and created coding for operating robots.





Twyford's Got Talent

There's a weekly music class and singing practice in every child's syllabus. There are orchestras, wind band, jazz band, singing groups, choirs and musical productions going on throughout the year. Parents enjoy our popular lunchtime concerts and some children are involved with professional productions such as the Opera at the Grange. We have been nominated for the 'Best Music Department' at the Music Education Awards and enjoy an excellent reputation for the quality of our performances and the musicians that we send out into the world.

Our music teachers inspire great things by taking time to explore personal tastes, to find an instrument, group or song that appeals and makes music enjoyable. With our combination of talented teachers, well-resourced teaching rooms and rehearsal facilities, Twyford is a wonderful platform for music in its many forms.

Treading the boards in one of our many School plays is something that every pupil will experience. If you're less inclined to be under the spotlight, there's plenty of opportunity to operate as part of our production team. One of the most popular events is our 'Twyford's got Talent' show which draws laughter and awe in equal measure – it's amazing what children can do! Year 8 children take part in a 'Shakespeare Week' run by professional actors culminating in their own end of year leavers' production. Drama is part of the School timetable and all children are offered tuition for the English Speaking Board and LAMDA exams.

Music is part of the fabric of School life; everyone takes part. An impressive 80% of children choose to have individual music lessons; with over 250 lessons in progress each week.

Twyford Explorers

Healthy body, healthy mind is a philosophy that hasn't changed over the many decades at Twyford. Within our grounds we enjoy incredible adventure facilities and woodlands where children can explore the natural world.

Our woodland shelter is popular as an outdoor learning centre, the location for pitching tents, evening stories and a gathering point for woodland projects. We often cook around the fire pit, making pitta bread, soup or toasting marshmallows together. Children learn bushcraft skills and how to enjoy the great outdoors safely.

Children from Nursery to Year 8 participate in a wide programme of outdoor pursuits which include residential adventure trips that extend in both length and skill base as the children advance through the School. They experience climbing, orienteering, sailing and canoeing trips throughout their time at School as well as our Year 6 and Year 8 trips to France.



THE GRANDPARENT

We love coming to see our grandchildren at School, doing all the wonderful things they can do here. They really can have experiences that they could simply not have elsewhere.

Most of all, though, we love that there is an innocence here that lets the children stay younger longer. That is so important. Pre-Prep

The majority of our pupils begin their Twyford education in the Pre-Prep (Nursery to Year 2). As our Nursery provision begins for children from 2 years, we are uniquely positioned to give pupils the very best foundation before their next chapter in the Prep school begins. The Pre-Prep provides a huge breadth of opportunity and learning experiences, and whilst the days are full of adventure, they are balanced with academic learning too; literacy including phonics, mathematics, history, geography and hands-on science are also an integral part of our curriculum.

The staff within the Pre-Prep are a wonderful team of highly experienced, qualified, caring and inspiring professionals. Small classes with Teaching Assistants and a high staff to pupil ratio enables personalised learning and for the interests of all our pupils to be nurtured. Our staff will always go the extra mile to ensure our children get the

very best out of their education, equipping them for their next step into the Prep school, motivated and enthusiastic, with a love of learning.

As well as having our own excellent resources, we make full use of the Prep facilities too. Pupils eat in the Prep Dining Hall and enjoy music, swimming, gymnastics and other sports. They also take full advantage of the wonderful Mulberry Pavilion for dance, drama workshops and our weekly Celebration Assembly.

Wrap around care is provided from 7.30am to 6.00pm everyday, to help parents juggle their work and homelife commitments knowing their children are happy and well cared for. We offer a wide range of after school clubs including sports, mindfulness, Twyford Explorers and cookery.



Our own Pre-Prep fruit and vegetable garden is looked after by Gardening Club and our rabbits, ducks and chickens are well loved members of Pre-Prep too.

The Great Outdoors

We make the most of learning opportunities inside and outside the classroom. Pre-Prep has its own Forest School which pupils attend each week, come rain or shine. Gathering around the campfire for hot chocolate and toasting marshmallows is a firm favourite as well as den building and hunting for bugs!

Play time is a hive of activity; racing a fleet of pedal cars around the racetrack circuit, exploring the adventure playground or performing to each other on the outdoor stage. We also have an orchestra of outdoor instruments, a water play zone and a large open games area.







Each class has their own free flow Nursery garden enabling all aspects of the Early Years Foundation Stage to be experienced inside and out.

Nursery

Nursery is the very first step into the Twyford education and sets the scene for our youngest pupils to thrive during their most precious early years. We have two Nursery classes, Little Acorns for our 2-3 year olds and Oaks for our 3-4 year olds.

The Nursery setting is rich in language, active learning, exploration, creativity and child-initiated play. Pupils are encouraged to think critically, develop their independence and celebrate the tiny steps as well as the giant leaps.

Pupils have access to the excellent resources shared by the rest of the Pre-Prep and participate in a wealth of activities including cookery, Forest School, ballet, music and swimming (Oak Class). Each day is full of exciting opportunities, yet there is still time for a little lunch time snooze to recharge those batteries.

Our Nursery staff build strong relationships with parents, nurturing a shared understanding of what is best for each child. We support each child with their toilet training journey and each day begins and ends with a thorough handover with your child's key person.

The Nursery day correlates with the rest of the Pre-Prep and Prep School, so we are able to offer wrap around care before the day starts (8.00 - 8.45am) and once the School day ends (4.00 - 6.00pm). Nursery pupils staying until 6.00pm are also given a hot supper so they are ready for their bedtime routine once they arrive home. Collection times are flexible and will depend on whether your child is just attending the morning session, staying for lunch or attending a full day.

As they near the end of their time in Nursery, children become familiar with life in Reception, so that once their Nursery years are complete, they move seamlessly into the Reception class to carry on their learning adventure.

THE REGISTRAR



Obviously most of the families I meet have been to see several schools, and so they should. I take them for a walk around the grounds. They are surprised and impressed, and yet other schools have lovely grounds.

I show them all our fabulous facilities – theatre, music, performance spaces, sports hall, swimming pool, science labs. These are seen to be marvellous and yet other schools have some of these too.

I show them some lessons in progress with our small class sizes and fabulous teachers, and yet some other schools also have a good academic track record.

I talk about our ethos of kindness above all and how we develop early on the crucial life skills that will set our children apart, and yet others may claim that too.

The Beehive	The pagoda-shaped shelter to the west end of the car park. The TPA notice board is situated on the adjacent wall.
