Part Time Modern Foreign Languages Teacher



The School:

Job Purpose:

We are seeking an inspirational, committed and talented linguist to join our MFL team, teaching French (other languages would be desirable). You will be responsible for delivering an engaging curriculum to multiple year groups from Early Years through to KS2.

The primary role is to encourage a love of languages and provide lessons that inspire and challenge every child. The successful candidate will also contribute to the School's extra-curricular programme.

Key Responsibilities

- Have a secure knowledge of the relevant subject/s and curriculum areas, foster and maintain pupils' interest in the subject
- To provide a stimulating working environment for pupils both inside and outside of the classroom
- To be accountable for pupil's attainment, progress and outcomes
- To refer to all the programmes of study and schemes of work that are in place
- To plan individual lessons appropriate to the needs, interests, experience and existing knowledge of the pupils in the classes taught
- To ensure individual plans are used where appropriate in all lessons
- To teach classes and set preparation work for the classes taught
- To mark and assess pupils' work and to record their development, progress and attainment
- To maintain good order and discipline in the classroom and around the School by promoting the School's Values and Learning Qualities, as well as safeguarding, health and safety
- The person appointed must respect the position of trust and responsibility attached to the post and be aware of the sensitive and confidential nature of much of the information to which they have access



- To establish good working relationships with all staff and to liaise with them as necessary
- To build and maintain co-operative relationships with parents and communicate with them on pupils' wellbeing, learning and progress
- To be part of the weekly duty team. This includes breaks, lunch times, departure and evening
- To play a full part in the life of the School including the extracurricular activities programme.
